In Washington DC, on March 19, 2010, the Executive Director and Founder of **Expediente Rojo Project Inc**, Zully Roman, was selected as one of the national recipients of the 2009 Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Director's Community Leadership Award. This honor has been awarded annually since 1990 by the Director of the FBI to publicly recognize community leaders who have made exceptional contributions in educating their communities about the harmful effects of violence and drugs, and by devising and implementing prevention strategies. The Los Angeles Office of the FBI nominated Mrs. Roman.

- **Urban Heroes (Heroes Urbanos)**; This section is a proud window to the accomplishments of men and women of the Hispanic community in the United States and Latin American who have become an important part of our society's success. These individuals are mentors and leaders in our community.
- **Red Code (Alerta Roja)**: Here we highlight possible danger, fraud alerts, violence situations and post active crime watches which Law Enforcement has released. In this space, we work to advise our readers of the most active crime alerts available in hopes of preventing our community from becoming victimized.
